### Township **Blendon Township Road Improvement Millage** Shall the tax rate limitation for Blendon Township be increased, and levied on all taxable property in the Township, in the amount of 1.5 mills (\$1.50 for each \$1,000 of taxable value), for twenty (20) years, from 2022 through and including 2041 for the structural maintenance, improvement and construction of both gravel and paved public roads within the Township?
